The Council had received an offer of assistance from Epping Forest District Council Animal Welfare officer regarding dog fouling in the cemetery.

#### 47/14 Clerk's Report

Allotments

It was reported that the Council's solicitor was working with Castle Farm Trustees to finalise the lease.

The No Parking sign on the gate at Castle St had been destroyed and a new sign had been ordered.

Cemetery

Cllr B. Surtees was interviewed on the radio about the problems with dog fouling in the cemetery. A copy of the interview was sent to all committee members by email. The agreed wording for the Cemetery leaflet had been passed to the Public Relations Clerk for printing with the other Council leaflets.

#### Dog waste bin

A new dog waste bin had been ordered and Council staff would refurbish an existing spare bin, both for use near the cemetery.

Greensted Rd play area

It was reported that the Council's solicitor was liaising with ECC regarding a new lease for this site.

Council staff were working with Community Payback Team to replace the surrounding fence.

#### Nature Reserve

The notice board in the reserve had been damaged and a replacement Perspex had been ordered.

Ongar Community Orchard (OCO)

The Council and OCO members met on 1<sup>st</sup> September for photographs to accompany the press release agreed at the last Open Spaces committee meeting.

#### **River Meadow**

The Council had requested that River Meadow be cut more than three times per year. EFDC Grounds Maintenance manager advised that this area was cut with the same frequency as other EFDC Housing land.

#### Vandalism

It was reported that the Clerk was compiling a data base of all instances of vandalism at Council owned or managed land. Cllr F. Knights reported that produce had been stolen from a farm in Moreton Rd.

## 48/14 Allotments

To receive the notes of the meeting with OAGS on 15 August 2014 Cllr A. Kaye and the Deputy Clerk met with representatives of OAGS and notes of the meeting were provided for Councillors information.

## AGREED

- To provide a lock on the gate at Moreton Rd allotments
- To provide a notice on the gate with contact details for the Council
- To provide a skip at Castle St allotments to assist with the removal of unwanted items e.g. glass
- The Clerk to contact tenants who were not working their plots
- To inform Shelley Residents Association of the recent damage

# 49/14 Centenary of World War I

To consider planting a tree to commemorate the centenary of World War I It was suggested that the Council considers planting a tree to commemorate the centenary of World War I, the location is yet to be decided.

Cllr B. Surtees proposed that this project be postponed until 2018 when a tree could be planted to commemorate the end of World War I. This was seconded by Cllr D. Roberts.

### 51/14 Cemetery

i) To consider the draft Disposal of Foetal Remains Policy and make a recommendation to Human Resources committee

At the last Open Spaces committee meeting amendments were suggested. An amended draft Policy was provided for Councillors consideration.

It was confirmed that the Council would comply with current legislation at all times. Councillors requested further amendments to the draft policy and considered the need for a separate policy.

- ii) To consider the proposed fee structure for the interment of Foetal remains and make a recommendation to Finance committee

Cllr B. Surtees proposed that the same fee be charged for foetal remains as for that of a child under 16 years. This was seconded by Cllr D. Roberts and unanimously agreed.

# **RECOMMEND** to Finance committee

- To charge the same fee for the interment of foetal remains as that of a child Clerk under 16 years
- iii) To note the time allocated to managing the cemetery by Council staff

It was reported that Council staff spend an average of 21.5 hours per week on the cemetery including administration and maintenance.

Councillors noted this information.

iv) To consider an increase in fees from April 2015 and make a recommendation to Finance committee

A copy of the current Fees and the proposed increase was provided for Councillors consideration.

Cllr B. Surtees proposed that the cemetery fees be increased slowly over a number of years to bring the Council in line with other local authorities. This was seconded by Cllr A. Kaye and unanimously agreed
